The following Ordinary Meeting of the Council is currently planned to take place at the Village Hall, How Lane, Castleton on Thursday 26th September 2024.

Bus Services update

The Parish Council continues to try and keep up to date on developments in rail and bus travel. Ideally, we are seeking a reliable and regular bus service with connectivity with Hope Station. After the inaugural meeting of the proposed Bamford Transport Hub there were no further meetings to date. We are disappointed to report that Northern Trains are not allowing 272/271 bus tickets on their trains as announced by organisations such as the Hope Valley Rail users group. This would have gone some way towards promoting one ticket across all services. It looks like we are back to lobbying for a more integrated transport service. In view of the recent election of the East Midlands Mayor, Clare Ward it is anticipated that there will be meetings of Derbyshire County Council's (DCC) Bus Services improvement Plan to discuss how her office can support bus services in rural areas such as the Hope Valley. It will be interesting to see what changes are introduced by the new Government. Recently there have been some developments in the number of buses serving our community and it would be helpful to monitor this provision by residents. This also applies to existing services where we would encourage you to report issues to the bus companies and consider getting involved in the action group (details below). At the same time, we are acutely aware of the challenges now facing our village and Bradwell, in view of the road closure at Brough.

High Peak Shopping Bus – An existing service to Chapel on Tuesday mornings. Funded by DCC and run by Ashbourne Community Transport where residents need to book to use the bus. We have now received details of the High Peak Shopping Bus to Buxton on a fixed route. This will be on a Thursday, commencing July 25th, at 11.30am in Bamford. **Bakewell and Eyam Community Transport** – covering the High Peak and Derbyshire Dales area. An existing service which also includes the car scheme to help residents access health appointments.

Stagecoach Open top Peak Sightseer Blue route from Chatsworth connecting with Hope, Bamford and Grindleford stations. Running until 26 October.

High Peak Buses route 66 – a new route run by High Peak Buses which commenced June 30th connecting Castleton to Buxton via Hope, Edale and Chapel. An interim leaflet was produced by DCC until new leaflets with timetable are available from High Peak Buses.

Better Buses for Castleton (BB4C) - our local action group continues to monitor and campaign for improved bus services. The group linked up with the national Better Buses campaigns and local networks such as Better Buses for Bakewell who contacted our group for advice and we will be meeting up shortly to consider how to promote the 173 service. BB4C are also supporting CPC with a Castleton Public Transport Survey 2024 which will be delivered to residents to assess demand for bus services, and guage opinion on bus service improvements. The group are now demanding an improved timetable and liaison with all bus service providers to cope with the increase in buses and congestion on the Winnats Pass, and the bus turning stop on How Lane.

Active Travel in the Hope Valley – DCC are developing an active travel masterplan which will support and encourage active and sustainable travel modes such as walking and cycling. We also reminded participants that horses should be considered. DCC has commissioned Jacobs the consultants to develop an Active Travel Plan over the next six months focusing on postcodes S32 and S33 which will cover the area from Edale and Castleton down to Calver and Eyam. We have been informed that they wish to work closely with Hope Valley Climate Action (HVCA), local authorities including parish councils, and residents to create a plan that meets a local community need. Yet it is unclear what funding is available to support this activity. This plan clearly is aimed at encouraging more use of public transport and therefore the discussion moved on to bus and rail service improvements, road safety and traffic issues which clearly impact on our village.

Finally, the Active Travel meeting highlighted other projects such as **Moving On**, which aims to encourage car and lift sharing. We have been contacted about another new project, **Move More**, focusing on wellbeing with a particular emphasis on walking for health.
